

Amersham Town 0: North Leigh 3.

A fragile Amersham Town supporter would not have completed their report of this relegation battle: they would have quit after the first goal. For the fourth game in succession Town then fell three behind by half time.

There was plenty of incident within the first ten minutes. First Town goal keeper Matt Messer had to dive full length to divert wide a shot from the right whilst, at the other end, North Leigh's Tom Russell did well to turn wide a goal bound shot from Amersham's Jae-Ru Kelly. The deadlock was broken on twenty four minutes. In a comedy of errors a long ball from North Leigh's midfield posed no danger but the home defence hesitated and Messer then drove his clearance straight at North Leigh's Ayo Akinboaw who had the simple job of walking the ball into the net.

Amersham then mounted some useful attacks without ever troubling Russell. Town were then undone on thirty seven minutes when, from an Amersham corner, North Leigh mounted a quick and well worked counter attack which ended with Jacob Sapwell hitting the ball across Messer into the far corner of the net. The scoring was completed in injury time in the first half when an attack from the left resulted in a Samuel Yabani goal.

The damage having been done, Amersham strove to pull back a goal, A number of well worked attacks from each wing just failed to find a finish whilst North Leigh posed dangers from their own wings. The game finished with an Amersham move involving Riley Durkin and Kelly making room for a Shaun Aram shot which passed just over the bar. It was perhaps symptomatic of Amersham's game, with good football failing to find a finish.

Amersham are next at home on bank holiday Monday 6th April to Reading City, kick off 11.30am.
